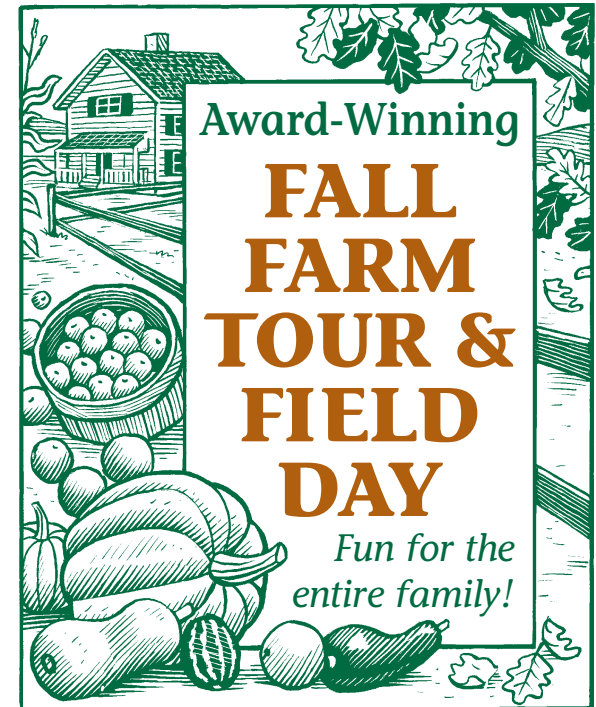

*Directions: From Rt. 29 south, turn right on Rt. 657, Kings Hill Road (at Moo Thru store) and travel approximately 1 mile to Cemetery Road, (Rt. 658) and turn right. Travel approximately 2 miles to the farm on your right.*

Cool Lawn Farm has been owned by the Smith family for 69 years, 47 years in Virginia. They milk over 600 dairy cows and own over 900 acres that is permanently protected in the Fauquier County PDR Program. The Smith family also own Moo Thru ice cream and dairy store at the intersection of Route 28 and 29 near Remington. The Smith family produce ice cream daily with the freshest ingredients. Moo Thru is now known as the number one ice cream store in Virginia serving over 250,000 people annually.

Join the Smith family for butter making demonstrations and a guided tour on a hayride every hour on the hour where you will see over 1000 head of dairy cattle and the recycling of all dairy waste. There will be a cattle roping demonstration at 2 o'clock. Baby cows will be available for petting and you will see a modern dairy operation as it works through its daily chores. Barbeque will be available to purchase as well as ice cream from Moo Thru.

*Directions: From Warrenton: Travel South on US 15/29 to Opal. Go South on US 17 to Bealeton. Turn left on VA 28 and go approximately 1 1/2 mi. to Market on right. Look for signs.*

Opened in 2014, Messick's Farm Market is an extension of third generation O. B. Messick & Sons dairy farm. The market has brought a wide variety of fresh produce, flowers, meats, dairy and baked goods to the community. They have a full service take-out deli serving many selections from the fields. Their mission is to "produce freshly picked, healthy, local food at a fair price, while maintaining the sustainability of our family farm." They invite customers to enjoy the pick-your-own experience. Visit Messick's Farm Market and enjoy the Fall Festival with hayrides, pumpkins, petting zoo, face painting, pumpkin cannons, games and more family fun. (\$10 admission, season passes available.)

*Directions: From I-95: Take exit for Rt. 17 North towards Warrenton. Follow to first traffic light after entering into Fauquier County, turn right onto Elk Run Road. Follow Elk Run Road approximately 8 miles. Turn right onto Barnes Road. Follow driveway to farm at the end of driveway.*

*From Warrenton: Take Meetze Road, Rt. 643 out of Warrenton to Catlett Road/ Rt. 28, take a right onto Rt. 28. Go approximately 1 mile, turn left on Germantown Road/ Rt. 649. Germantown Road turns into Midland Road after crossing the railroad tracks. Follow along to the stop sign at Elk Run Road, take a left onto Elk Run Road. Go approximately 1.5 miles to right onto Barnes Road. Follow driveway to farm at the end of driveway.*

*From I-66: Take exit 44 to Prince William Parkway, Rt. 234, then follow to Rt. 28 South. Follow Rt. 28 South through Catlett and make a left at traffic light onto Elk Run Road. Cross over railroad tracks and follow approximately 9 miles. Take a left onto Barnes Road. Follow to Farm at the end of the driveway.*

Greenfield Farms Alpacas was established in 2007. Our farm is a family run and owned farm, situated on 20 beautiful open acres. Visitors will learn about all aspects of these amazing animals and their fiber, from fleece, to finished garments and everything in between. We educate on how to breed, raise, and sell alpacas as livestock animals. Fiber processing, spinning, and feltings discussions and demonstrations will also be conducted throughout the day. Alpaca fleece, roving, toys, apparel and yarn will be available for purchase. Alpaca yarns are available in natural and dyed colors. The farm has transitioned to field crops and vegetables over the past several years. Willowlyn Farms CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) began operation in 2010. Come learn how a CSA works and what types of fresh produce are available by joining. The farm's motto is "Simply Fresh, Simply Local". Tours of the vegetable farm will be available at 11am and 2pm. *Directions: From Warrenton: Take Meetze Road south to Rt 28/Catlett Road, at the stop sign take a right. Take a right onto Germantown Road. Germantown road will turn into Midland road. Take a right onto Elk Run Road then a slight left onto Elk Run Church Road. Winery will be on your left.*

*Directions: From Warrenton: Take Meetze Road south out of town, approximately 7 minutes, and then turn right onto our farm at Redemption Way, directly opposite Casanova Road.*

*From DC / Route 66 / Gainesville: Take Exit 42 (Gainesville) to Rt 29 South, drive until you see the Meetze Road Exit (exit on the right, to an overpass). Take a left onto Meetze Road and then turn right onto our farm at Redemption Way, directly opposite Casanova Road.*

Powers Farm & Brewery is an integrated sustainable farm, hopyard and brewery, with an onsite tap room open to the public. Our fruits and vegetables come mostly from organic and heirloom see stock, and we grow everything sustainably without any chemical fertilizers or pesticides. We practice companion planting and grow a wide variety of flowers that attract beneficial insects. The brewery focuses on small batch beers that highlight flavors from our field, integrated into classic styles.

Fruits and vegetables are sold exclusively through a summer CSA—a 20 week program that provides freshly picked produced to our members once a week. The farm beers are available at our tap room in sample flights, pints or growlers to go, open Thursday through Sunday. Stop in and learn about vegetable and hops production and sample some local product.
